

By the Petition of Francis A. Faxon of Snow Mountain County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at September term, eighteen hundred and sixteen, in two cases the sum of six Pounds current money in each case, for selling spirituous liquors without license. The Petitioner states that he acted from ignorance, and from no intention of violating the law, his license having expired before he was aware of it - that he is poor with a large family to support, and that he is unable to pay the said fines - The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County, do remit the said fines amounting in the whole to the sum of forty eight Pounds.

In order to bring the said John Giblets to justice, I have in pursuance of the Constitution of the United States, and the Act of Congress passed on the twelfth of February, seventeen hundred and ninety three, entitled, "an Act respecting fugitives from justice and persons escaping from the service of their masters," to demand of your Excellency
