 time mentioned he had on all previous occasions both under the laws of the General
 State Governments in due time procured the necessary license. That after the expiration
 of a license taken out in the month of August eighteen hundred and twenty, he was
 of his time occupied in the settlement of an estate committed to his charge by the will of
 a deceased Brother which estate was situated in another county, and attended with
 many very perplexing difficulties. This circumstance together with the many concerns of
 a large family caused him to omit renewing the license. That he has a large family
 dependent on him for support. The Board do in consideration of which circumstances
 and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit so much of the
 said fine as the State is entitled to.

By the Petition of Henry Morse of Frederick County, accompanied by a
 Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears that he
 was fined by the said Court at March term eighteen hundred and twenty one in
 sum of sixteen dollars for selling whiskey contrary to law. The Petitioner states
 that he removed from the State of Pennsylvania, in the year eighteen hundred
 and twenty, and settled a Tavern stand in Frederick County at that time occupied
 by Lawrence Hager, that he purchased of the said Hager, the right of his license
 for that year, thinking that he might sell in said Tavern by that right, until the
 expiration of that year, as is customary in Pennsylvania. The Petitioner states
