I acknowledge to have received of Lieutenant Colonel Boniford of the Ordnance.  
The foregoing Cannon, carriage, implements, equipments and harness complete for the use  
of the State of Maryland, being a part of their Quota of Arms furnished by the United  
States under the law of 1808, for arming and equipping the whole body of Militia

Samuel Spragg.

Ordered that the Executive will receive from the General Government, four  
hundred stand of Rifles with the necessary accoutrements in part of her proportion of arms  
due to the State of Maryland from the United States, and that Major William Hensbury  
be appointed to receive the said Rifles from the United States, and pay his receipt for the  
same which shall be binding on this State.
