

County, and received a writ of fieri facias against a certain Charles Goldsbrough of the said County, in virtue of which he did in the spring of the said year take in execution the personal property of the said Goldsbrough. That before the sale of the said property in the spring of the year aforesaid, and before the publication of the law paper at December fifteen eighteen hundred and twenty, the said Charles Goldsbrough suspended the said writ and writs for which the said execution issued, and the Petitioner did charge and receive from the said Goldsbrough a poundage fee on the said execution, under the impression and being advised that he had a right to do so. That he had no knowledge of the law paper at December fifteen 1820, incorporating into one the several acts of Assembly relating to constable fees Chapter 166. The Court of Talbot County having stated their belief of the above, and having recommended a remission of the said fine. The Board do order and direct that he be released from so much of the fine as the State is entitled to.
