By the Petition of Charles W. Hall of Talbot County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at May Term last the sum of two hundred dollars for taking illegal fees in two cases. The Petitioner states that he was appointed a constable in the said County in eighteen hundred and twenty one, and that he received two writs of fieri facias one against William Harrison of James, and the other against Henry Ward. By virtue of which he did take in execution certain property of the said Harrison and Ward - That previous to the sale of said property, and before the publication of the laws passed at Dec-ember Session 1820, the said Harrison and Ward superseded the debt and costs for which the said writs of execution issued, and the Petitioner did charge, take and receive from the said Harrison and Ward a poundage fee on said executions, under the impression that it was lawful for him so to do, and that knowing that a law had passed at the Session of eighteen hundred and twenty one making it unlawful for him to do so - that he acted under
