

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore of the State of Maryland be directed to call on the General Government and receive from her five hundred and twenty seven dollars overpaid to her by the said State in September eighteen hundred and eleven for loans which were not received, and for the repayment of which an appropriation has been made by a law passed at the last session of Congress.

Thursday June the 13<sup>th</sup> 1822

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor, and the honorable Isaac D. Maulsby, Thomas H. Wilkinson, James Butcher, Nicholas Bauer and James Nabb.

Isaac Griffin now confined in the Jail of New Castle County, in the State of Delaware, is charged by the deposition of sundry negroes, the property of the Heirs of Robert Ward of Cecil County deceased, and other respectable Citizens of the said County, of having aided and assisted them to make their escape from the service of their Masters into the State of Delaware. In pursuance of the Constitution of the United States, and the provisions of the act of Congress passed in February 1793, I have to demand of your Excellency the said Isaac Griffin as a fugitive from justice, and that he be delivered to Francis Gillispie, Esquire, the Sheriff of Cecil County, whom I have appointed to receive him, and to remove him to this State, to answer the offence with which he is charged. The Depositions are duly authenticated and enclosed.
