By the Petition of Lawrence Greatrake, it appears that he was fined by Baltimore County Court, at September Term last, one hundred dollars, for selling foreign goods and Merchandise without license. The Petitioner states that he has a Paper Manufactory established near the City of Baltimore, and for the accommodation and convenience of the numerous persons employed by him in his said Manufactory, he sometime since established at his Manufactory a small Store, containing groceries and merchandize, which he sold or bartered to his workmen on account of their wages. That the goods and Merchandize thus sold and bartered, were delivered to his workmen at the cost and selling price, without realising or wishing to realise any profit thereon, and solely for the convenience of his workmen, who would otherwise have lost much time in leaving the factory to procure the articles they wanted at places remote therefrom. That some time since, without his knowledge and approbation, some articles were sold out of said Store, to a person named Jacob Chandler, who gave information thereof to the Grand Jury for Baltimore County. The Board do on consideration of the circumstances
