

By the Petition of Charles M. Nabb, of Talbot County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears, that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of one hundred dollars for the appearance of John Boyman, a free negro, to answer at the said Court at May term, eight teen hundred and twenty one, a charge of stealing a bag of feathers of the value of twenty five cents, the property of Thomas Leonard. The Petitioner states that the said Recognizance was respited to November term, eighteen hundred and twenty one, that the said John Boyman was between the said Terms arrested and imprisoned, in the City of Baltimore, for selling as a slave to a foreigner, a free negro Boy, that the said Boyman has since been convicted and sentenced to the Penitentiary. The Board do on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said forfeiture on payment of costs.
