Whereas the Governor in his communication hath advised that owing to
the late afflicting dispensations by disease, a day be set apart by the General Assembly
and recommended to the people of this State to be observed as a day of humiliation and
prayer. Therefore be it Resolved by the General Assembly that the Thirteenth day
March next be set apart and recommended to the People of this State to be observed
as a day of humiliation and prayer, and that this Resolution be published in such
New Papers throughout the State as the Governor and Council may direct for the
information of the Citizens thereof.
