The Petitioner states that at the time the judgment of the said Court was passed he was poor and not able to pay the fine, and that in consequence of his not being able to do so he has remained in Jail ever since and without the intervention of the Executive must be deemed to undergo an interminable imprisonment. The Board do on the recommendation of the honourable Abraham Thayer an associate Judge of the said Court and a number of respectable persons Inhabitants of said County remit the said fine of twenty dollars.
