A mulatto man by the name of John the slave of James Thompson of Saint Marys County in this State charged with horse stealing by the Affidavit of William Bennett and by the affidavit of Henry Brown of stealing a bundle from him and seven quarter dollars and a saddle from Glem Butler - And it appearing that the said John has fled from this State to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from justice - we have in the name of the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland to demand of your Excellency the said John as a fugitive from justice and that he be delivered to Mr Ulich Thompson who has been appointed Agent to receive him and to remove him to this State having jurisdiction of the offences with which he is charged. For your Excellency's satisfaction we enclose you the affidavits duly authenticated on which the application is grounded.
