

Joshua Lyon at the said Court, at October Term 1822, to answer a charge of stealing a pair of Boots, the property of James Langston, that the said Joshua Lyon neglecting to appear at the said Term, the recognizance was respited till March Term 1823. The Petitioner states by great exertion between the said Terms he arrested and took into his custody the said Lyon, had him secured and locked up in jail, there to remain until the meeting of the Court, in order that he might be produced in said Court, but before the meeting of the same, the said Lyon made his escape. The Petitioner states that he cannot pay the said sum of money without great distress to himself, he being a poor man & The Board do on consideration of which circumstances, and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County, release the said Joshua Lyon from the said forfeiture of sixty dollars -

By the Petition of Isaac Drampton of Caroline County, it appears, that he was fined by Caroline County Court, at March Term 1823, one hundred dollars, for selling foreign goods, wares and Merchandize without license - The Petitioner states that he did not consider it necessary to obtain a license for the sale of other Merchandize than liquors, which he never sold - that when he commenced selling, he consulted some of his neighbours to know if it were necessary to take out licence before he sold, and was told by them that it was not, as the Law had been repealed. That he has since understood from them that it was the Law of the United States which they alluded to, and that they did not know of the State Law - that he violated the Law from ignorance and not design - that he is in moderate circumstances with a young and growing family dependent on him for support.
