time to keep the Peace - that the said John Cooper was guilty of no breach of the
Peace during the time aforesaid, but from a misapprehension of what was
further imposed upon him by the recognizances aforesaid he neglected to appear
whereby the recognizance was forfeited - The Board do, on consideration of which
circumstances and the recommendation of the Court of the said County
remit the said forfeitures.
