By the Petition of William Gullett of Somerset County, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County, it appears, that he was fined by the said Court at November term, eighteen hundred and twenty three, twenty Pounds for selling spirituous liquors without license. The Petitioner states that being unable to pay the said fine, he was committed to the Jail of the said County, and has been confined ever since, and where he must remain unless the fine is remitted. That he is poor - in bad health, and has four children dependent on him for support. That one of the children is blind and an Infant. The Board do on consideration of these circumstances, and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County, remit the said fine of twenty Pounds.
