

a day of humiliation and Prayer, Proclamation for the apprehension of Conrad Johnson, Notice to Levy Court Justices to meet to lay taxes, Act relating to Somerset County, retailers of dry goods, Act relating to Civil rights, Proclamations for the apprehension of Duvall and Swings, an order respecting the Council of the Netherlands and Resolution appointing a day of humiliation and Prayer of December 6<sup>th</sup> 1823 as per account paper and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Brown, Esquire, Examiner General for the Western Shore, one hundred and two dollars and twenty two and a third cents, it being the balance of three months salary due him on the 6<sup>th</sup> instant, after deducting the amount of fees received by him to the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March, as per account and affidavit filed.

Ordered, that the Resolution respecting Pensioners be published once a week for six weeks in the Maryland Republican and Maryland Gazette at Annapolis, The Patriot, American and Federal Gazette at Baltimore, The Star and Gazette at Easton, The Bond of Union in Bellehar, Bingham's Paper in Montgomery, The Examiner at Frederick Town, The Herald at Hagerstown, The National Intelligencer and The Allegany Paper.

Friday March 12<sup>th</sup> 1824

His Excellency the Governor and the honourable Nicholas Brown, appeared in the Council Room.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Alexander Stuedt, thirty one and an half cents, for hauling and putting away one load of coal for the use of the Senate.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs Ann Lovacker, forty dollars, for one Quarters half pay due the first of February last.
