The Petitioner states that he did attend said Court, during the whole of said term, and that his Recognizance was not called, that he has upon all occasions obeyed the orders of the Court, that he is very poor, and has a large family depending on him for support, that unless the Executive grant relief he will be compelled to go to Jail, not being able to discharge the forfeiture. The Board do on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the said Court release the said George Hellingale and Samuel Scott from the said forfeitures
