John Pridmore members of the Council.

The following order was drawn in favor of Washington of Tick Armours at Annapolis. viz

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Washington of Tick Esq one hundred and twenty five Dollars for one quarter salary as Armourer at Annapolis and there pay.

A Message was sent to the House of Delegates in compliance with their order relative to the Western limits of the State for which see letter book.

Solon Hoffman's account for cleaning Arms and repairing by order of the Executive was presented and examined and allowed for the amount of one hundred and ten Dollars eighteen cents and three fourths, and the following order given him for the same viz

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Solon Hoffman one hundred and ten Dollars eighteen cents and three fourths for cleaning and repairing arms by order of the Executive for as allowed.

By the petition of Aquilla Beatty (Judge of the Peace for County of Prince George's) accompanied by a transcript from the records of Prince George's County. And it appears that a recognizance was entered into by John C. Prather in the sum of fifty pounds and Walter Prather and Thomas Gillo in the sum of twenty five pounds each for the appearance of the said John C. Prather before the Judge of Prince George's County Court to answer and to keep the peace &c. as entered as forfeited on the 30 day of September 1822. It is stated by the Clerk that the said Recognizance was returned to the said County Court at April Term 1820; that at September Term 1820 or April 1821 the parties were discharged from it as appears by a certificate and receipt for the fees that had accrued on it by Mr. Smith who then acted as Deputy Clerk for him dated during the session of the Court but that in the hurry of business it was neglected to enter the discharge on the Docket. That some time after the time the said Deputy Smith left the Office, and Mr. Marbury who succeeded him continued the case on the Docket until September Term 1822, when by order of the Court the recognizance was forfeited. That during this time amount of the recognizance was changed to £50 the principal and £25 security the mistake, and returned to the Treasurer as forfeited for
