The Petitioner states that his violation of the Law proceeded from Ignorance and not design; he therefore prays to be released from the payment of the said fine, and the Judges of the said Court having recommended its remission and states that the Petitioner had paid the License money for the aforesaid period, and that they believe the violation of the Law proceeded from ignorance and not from design.
