On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, Samuel Sprigg, Philip E. Thomas and Timothy Fitzhugh Esquires were appointed Commissioners on the part of this State for receiving subscriptions to the Stock of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and commissions issued to them accordingly.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, George M. Eichelberger was appointed Register of Wills for Frederick County until the next meeting of the General Assembly vice Henry Steiner deceased, and commissions issued to him accordingly.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, James Langston was appointed Register of Wills for Caroline County until the next meeting of the General Assembly vice George A. Smith deceased, and commissions issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas Harris and Reverdy Johnson Esquires five hundred dollars for the balance due them for two hundred copies of the fifth volume of Harris & Johnson's Reports of Contract.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Charles T. Huper or order twenty dollars for translating a document in French received from the Secretary of the French Legation.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council call on Reverdy Johnson Esquire Executor of the late Chancellor Johnson for a settlement of the accounts of the said late Chancellor Johnson as a Commissioner to settle the Western limits of this State.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, Levin W. Ballard was appointed a Justice of the Levy Court of Calvert County vice Sutton & Weems deceased, and a new commission issued to John Ireland, Young Parran, ^{John Rawlings} Joshua Sedwick, Benjamin Williams, David C. Lyles and Levin W. Ballard.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, John Tillman (being the next upon the recommendation of the Levy Court of Anne Arundel County) was appointed Inspector of Tobacco at Tracy's Landing Ware House vice John Tillard deceased, and commissions issued to him accordingly.
