Carter & Kimmel Godwin.

A Copy of the Record of the Conviction of William Turvey for the Murder of William John Holloman, and his condemnation and sentence by the special Court of Oyer and Terminer and general Goal delivery for Charles County, having been received. The following Warrant for his Execution was issued by His Excellency the Governor viz

The State of Maryland, to the Sheriff of Charles County Greeting Whereas a certain William Turvey, has been indicted, arraigned and found guilty of assaulting and murdering on the sixth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, one William John Holloman, and was by Charles County Court specially called on the sixteenth day of May last sentenced to be hanged by the neck until he be dead.

There are therefore to will and require, as also to charge and command you, that on or before twelve of the Month of July, next, you take the said William Turvey from your Prison and him safely convey to the Gallows in the County aforesaid the place of the execution of Malefactors, and there the said William Turvey hang by the neck until he be dead; for all which this shall be your sufficient power and authority. Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this fifteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five.

His Excellency the Governor has signified the following order to the Sheriff of Charles County, respecting the execution of William Turvey viz  
The State of Maryland, to the Sheriff of Charles County Greeting  
Whereas sundry respectable persons have expressed their desire that the time fixed by my Warrant dated the fifteenth instant, for the execution of William Turvey, lately convicted of the murder of William John Holloman, may be extended, to afford the said convict more ample time to prepare for the final catastrophe which awaits him. I have thought proper in consequence thereof to suspend the execution of the said William Turvey until twelve o'clock of Friday the fifth day of August next, at which time you are to execute the said William Turvey, as heretofore directed unless otherwise directed by lawful authority.
