By the Petition of Thomas Baldwin accompanied by a transcript

By the Petition of Alon Luginbee & Joseph L. Wagner, accompanied  
by a transcript from the Records of Frederick County Court, it appears that  
they ~~had~~ entered into a recognizance in the sum of \$500 jointly and severally
