By the Petition of John Milhous, accompanied by a transcript from the Record of Harford County Court, it appears that he was fined \$6 in two several cases in the County Court at March term 1825 for selling liquor without license.

The Petitioner states that he does not deny that Slet William Gibson, the prosecuting witness, had two quarts of whiskey for which the two fines were imposed as fixed by Law, but he expressly declares that the said Gibson never did pay him one cent therefor. He declares that he never pretended to retail or keep spirituous liquor for that purpose, and that he had no intention of violating the Law to put money into his own pocket. That being in the habit of fishing and having some whiskey left at the close of the season, which the said Gibson knew, he the said Gibson came to him at two different times and begged him to spare a quart at each time which was done merely to accommodate him without once supposing the law would be violated by such a transaction. He further states that the said circumstances would not have come to the knowledge of the Court had not the said Gibson for certain cause, become offended with him. He states that he is poor and unable to pay the said fines and fees, that the fees alone will be a severe infliction upon him. He therefore prays that the said fines may be remitted. And sundry respectable Gentlemen having stated their belief in the truth of the facts set forth by the petitioner, and together with the said Court having recommended him to the clemency of the Executive, the Board do hereby remit the said fines.
