

August 18 1825.

The Executive of the State of Virginia having declined to comply with the demand made upon it by the Executive of this State on the 8th ultimo for the delivery of John Peters alias Connor to the Agent of this State as a fugitive from Justice, upon the ground that the evidence upon which said demand was made was not such as the Law required, although the objection to the evidence, was not admitted to be sound and substantial, but on the contrary the propriety of the said Demand vindicated in reply to the objection, yet to remove all difficulty and satisfy the views of the Executive of Virginia, His Excellency the Governor this day issued a new Demand upon His Excellency the Governor of Virginia of the said John Peters alias Connor as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, accompanied by further evidence, and appointed Major Thomas Kamm of the City of Annapolis, Agent to receive the said fugitive, to whom he requested that the Executive of Virginia would cause the said fugitive to be delivered, to be brought to this State for trial in Torall which see the letter book.

His Excellency John Andrew Shultz Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, having in pursuance of the Constitution and Laws of the United States, made a demand upon His Excellency the Governor of this State of a certain David Q Tobias as a fugitive from the Justice of the said Commonwealth, and requested that he be delivered to Samuel P. Garrigue one of the high constables of the City of Philadelphia legally authorized to receive him, and convey him to Pennsylvania for trial. His Excellency the Governor of this State in compliance with said Demand issued the following Order viz.

State of Maryland to wit. (To the Sheriff of Baltimore County Greeting.)
Whereas it appears from authentic Documents, certified and transmitted to this Department by His Excellency John Andrew Shultz Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, that a certain David Q Tobias, late of the City of Philadelphia in the said Commonwealth, stands charged with having committed in the said City the crime of Larceny, and with having fled from the Justice of the said Commonwealth into this State, and that he has been arrested, and is now confined in the Jail of the City of Baltimore, charged with the said larceny.
And whereas the said John Andrew Shultz Governor as aforesaid, hath in pursuance of the authority given in such cases by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded the said David Q Tobias of the Executive of this State as a fugitive from Justice; and appointed Samuel P. Garrigue one of the high constables of the City of Philadelphia, an Agent to receive the said fugitive, and transport him to the said Commonwealth for trial. I have therefore thought proper to order and direct that you deliver the said David Q Tobias to the said Samuel P. Garrigue to be removed to the said Commonwealth, provided that he has not been committed to your custody for having violated, or being charged with having violated any of the Laws of this State, and provided also that the said Samuel P. Garrigue do first pay and discharge all costs of the arrest, commitment and imprisonment of the said David Q Tobias.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this Sixth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, and of the Independence of the United States the fifth.
