

By the Petition of Michael Cobbett and Juliett Cobbett, accompanied by a  
transcript from the Record of Frederick County Court it appears that they were fined  
by the said Court at August Term 1825 the sum of five dollars each for assault  
& battery &c. The Petitioners state that from extreme poverty they are unable  
to pay said fines, and in consequence have been and yet are confined in the Gaol  
of said County. In consideration whereof they that the clemency of the Executive  
be extended towards them. And their respectable Gentlemen and also one of  
the Judges of the said Court having recommended the remission of the said  
fines the Board do hereby remit the same. (Signed) Phil Chew

By the Petition of Lawrence Everitt and Edward Everitt of Queen  
Anne's County it appears that the said Lawrence Everitt was presented by  
the Grand Jury of said County in five several cases; and that he entered into  
recognizance in the sum of fifty dollars in each case for his personal appearance  
before the said Court until by them discharged. That from sickness and other  
causes the said Lawrence could not attend the Court agreeably to his said  
recognizance in consequence of which they were forfeited. That he was  
afterwards committed to the Gaol of the County and brought to trial when on  
hearing the Court acquitted him from the charges laid in said presentments.  
That the said Edward Everitt was also presented by the said Grand  
Jury in one case, and that he entered into recognizance on the same  
terms and in the same penalty as the said Lawrence; that the said Edward  
was discharged by the Court from his daily attendance as the said Lawrence  
was, & attend to the said Edward's business; that the said Lawrence was  
afterwards thrown from his carriage & very materially injured, so as to prevent  
him for a long time from attending to any thing. That in consequence of  
said misfortune and the said Edward's not attending the Court his  
recognizance was also forfeited; that he was afterwards committed to the  
Gaol of the County and brought to trial and acquitted. — They therefore  
pray that the said fines may be remitted. The Board do hereby (the  
Court having recommended) remit the said fines.

salary for taking care of the public property ending the 20th of July and  
expense of firing salute the 4th day of July of amount allowed.
