His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Jacob Kiron, who had been convicted in Winchester County Court of shooting with intent to kill, and sentenced to the Penitentiary: He having been recommended to mercy by the Directors of the Penitentiary and many other respectable Citizens.
