Ordered that Ramsay Waters Register of the Court of Chancery be authorized and required to deliver to each or any of the Gentlemen appointed by the Executive (namely William C Beall, George Brown, Isaac Hines, Henry Hobbs and Joseph Mayo) to record the un-recorded Chancery papers, under Resolutions of the General Assembly, such portions of the said papers, Dockets and other books relating thereto, as they may deem necessary to enable them to proceed with the said Recording, upon the order of Thomas Fullreth under whose superintendence the papers have been placed by the Executive. —

By the petition of John Delozer, accompanied by a transcript from the Record of Charles County Court, it appears that a certain Edward Briscoe entered into a recognizance in the sum of £50, with Charles Fletcher and the said John Delozer his securities, in the sum of £25 each for the appearance of the said Edward Briscoe before the said County Court at August Term 1824, and for his good behaviour to Rezin B Parker &c. which said recognizance was by the said Court declared forfeited. The Petitioner represents that the said Edward Briscoe did attend the said County Court agreeably to his recognizance, and was frequently in the Court House during the said term, but being ignorant of the necessity of tendering his body to the Court, that was not done, and the said recognizance was declared forfeited as aforesaid. He therefore prays a remission of the said forfeiture, which being recommended by the said Court is hereby granted.
