

By the Petition of Richard Carson, accompanied by a transcript from the proceedings of Talbot County Court, it appears, that he was fined by the said Court, at its winter term 1825, the sum of fifty dollars for an affray with James Seamy. The Petitioner represents that he is a poor man with a rising family, and that the said fine, with the costs of prosecution, is a sum too great for his limited means. That he has always pursued the course of peace for which he was fined, lived an orderly and peaceful life, and that he was unfortunately brought into the commission of the said offence, by representations made to him of aspersing and injuries by the said James Seamy of the most improper character, that he has already, in his wounded feelings, amply atoned for the violation of the law, and that the payment of the fine (together with the costs, which cannot be got rid of) will greatly oppress his innocent family. He, therefore, prays to be released from the said fine: and sundry respectable citizens of Talbot County, having recommended the said Richard Carson as a fit object of Executive clemency. — the said fine is hereby remitted.
