

and directed the Governor and Council to build or purchase (at their discretion) a
fire proof Warehouse or Store in the City of Baltimore, suitable for the inspection
and storage of Tobacco. Proposals will be received at this Department until
the twelfth day of June next for the sale of Warehouses of the above description,
and of proper sites on which to erect such Warehouses.

The net revenue arising from the inspection of Tobacco is at present
and placed under the direction and control of the Governor and Council,
to enable them to carry into effect the spirit and direction of the General
Assembly, and will be paid to such persons paying as they may contract
with in the authority of power in the following manner: viz. Such as
shall have accounts due to the Treasury at the time of contracting will
be paid at that time and thereafter all the net-revenue accruing and
received into the Treasury will be paid quarterly until the whole amount
of such contract or contracts are fully paid, with interest on the balance at
the rate of five per centum per annum from the time the contract or contracts
may be made.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council write to the Tobacco
Inspectors at the State Warehouses, and request them to report the advantages
and disadvantages, if any, of the Store now occupied by the State; also their
Capacity, and the number of Tonnage it will be necessary that their Store
to be purchased or built for the State shall have capacity to contain, and generally
such further information as they may deem necessary to enable the Executive to
carry into effect, with most advantage, the object of the General Assembly,
in authorizing them to purchase or build Tobacco Warehouses.

Toney for or over one thousand dollars for Counsel fee in the Suit by
the Administrator of Louise Borrowing against Charles Carroll of Carrollton,
for Suit Rent.

Ordered that the several Acts of Assembly, proposing alterations in, or amend-
ments to, the Constitution, which were passed at December Session last; and also the Act
entitled An Act to provide for the public instruction of Youth in primary schools throughout
this State be published, once a week for four weeks in the Maryland Republican, and
