The said John Patterson and Archibald McLean being severally, recommended to Executive Clemency by many respectable citizens of the City of Baltimore. — (see Parson Record).

Saturday April 29th 1826

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to William Jeffry for stealing a watch, for which he had been convicted in Baltimore City Court. He being recommended to Executive Clemency by the Court and the jury before which he was convicted. — (see Parson Record).

Friday May 12 1826

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Margaret Ivory for receiving stolen goods, for which she had been convicted in Baltimore City Court. She being recommended to Executive Clemency by the jury that convicted her and by Doctors Nathl Potter. (see Parson Record)

Monday May 15 1826

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a full Pardon to Matilda Jennings who was presented by the Grand Inquest for St. Marys County for feloniously taking a piece of fabric out of the store of Bennett Gough. The said Matilda Jennings being recommended to Executive Clemency by many respectable citizens of St. Marys County. (see Parson Record).

Thursday May 18 1826

The following demand was made upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of Delaware for the person therein named, as a fugitive from justice, upon application and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in this Department. viz.

To His Excellency the Governor of the State of Delaware.

Whereas a certain Thomas Clow late of Queen Anne's County Yeoman, has been indicted by the Grand Inquest of the State of Maryland for the body of Queen Anne's County, for having in his possession and passing, three several false, forged and counterfeited notes purporting to be of the Philadelphia Bank, or for true and genuine notes of the said Bank, knowing the said several notes to be false, forged, and counterfeit as aforesaid. And whereas it is represented to the Executive Authority of this State, that the said Thomas Clow do as aforesaid. Indicted has fled from the justice of this State to the State of Delaware, and that he is now confined in the jail of New Castle County in said State. Now, therefore, I Joseph Kent Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the United States, and the act of Congress passed on the twelfth day of February one thousand seven hundred and nine entitled An act respecting fugitives from justice and persons escaping from the
