

By a transcript from the proceedings of St Albans County Court, it appears, that the said Court, at a sittings term 1824, imposed upon George Buckler of the said County, a fine of sixteen dollars each for selling spirituous liquors without license. The said George Buckler by his petition represents that he is a poor and uneducated man, with a wife and child dependent on him for support, and that it has been his unfortunate lot to be guilty of violating the laws, for which he is now in prison, from an inability to pay or give security for, the said fines; that aware of his improper conduct, and with a view to return to his helpless family, and assist in their support by honest labour, he begs for a remission of the aforesaid fines, promising that his present situation shall be a warning to the future. And the representations of the petition being in the main supported by many of his neighbours, who also recommended that the prayer of his petition be granted. The said fines are hereby remitted.

By a transcript from the proceedings of Baltimore County Court, it appears that the said Court at a sittings term 1824, imposed upon Lloyd C. Quinan of the said County, a fine of one hundred dollars, for selling spirituous liquors without license. The said Lloyd C. Quinan by his petition represents, that he is a young man commencing life, with little experience of the world, with a young wife and slender means of support. That being desirous of making a living by honest industry, he provided himself with a license, and with two pounds of silver for the use of family &c. That Benjamin Standiford his neighbour, and the witness for the prosecution against him, came to him representing that his, the said Standiford's aged mother was sick; that he could not then without much inconvenience procure her a dish of tea, and finally prevailed with the said petitioner to spare one quarter of a pound, for said purpose. The said petitioner further represents, that an unwarranted enemy compelled the said Standiford to appear against him, and was the sole cause instigator of the stated process against him, which resulted in the aforesaid fine. He, therefore, prays for a remission of the said fine. And the representations of the petition being confirmed by the said Benjamin Standiford, and by sundry other respectable Citizens, who recommended that the prayer of his petition be granted: and said Court having also joined in the said recommendation. The said fine is hereby remitted.

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
