Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Trisby Tighman, Thomas Emory and Benedict J Lemmes Esquires ~~the~~ hundred and sixty six dollars forty four cents, for their pay and expenses in examining into the State and Condition of the Penitentiary, under Resolution of the General Assembly at the last Session, ~~the~~ amount allowed. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Regim Spruill or order five dollars seventy five cents for sweeping chimneys in the State House and Government House ~~the~~ amount allowed. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Isaac Munroe or order forty eight dollars and fifty cents, ~~and \$2.50~~ for publishing in his paper by order of the Executive, proposals to deliver the Laws and Notes and proceedings, two dollars for proposals for Tobacco Warehouses, Lots &c; thirty dollars for an ad relative to public school, and fourteen dollars for acts proposing alterations in the Constitution, ~~the~~ amount paid and filed. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Isaac Hines or order forty four dollars for delivering the Laws and Notes and proceedings of the last Session of the Legislature to the Clerks of the several Counties and the Eastern Shore. ~
