On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council The Hon^{ble} John Buchanan, Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals, and Thomas James Bullitt Esquire, were appointed to revise, digest and collate the Laws of this State, under a Resolution of the General Assembly passed, at the last Session, No 95.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, John M Pherson of Frederick County was appointed, a member of the board of Public Works, vice Richard Potts resigned.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, William L Gill, Henry Green, Emanuel Kent and George Myers were appointed Justices of the Peace for Baltimore County, residing in the City of Baltimore by virtue of the act of Assembly passed at the last Session entitled "An act to authorize the appointment of Justices of the Peace in the City of Baltimore with limited jurisdiction", and commission issued to them, accordingly.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by, and with the advice and consent of the Council, Thomas Barnett, William Banning, Levin Jones (Castle Haven) and John W Humphreys, were appointed additional Justices of the Peace for Dorchester County, and commission issued to them, accordingly.
