

at the State Warehouse, were this day examined, and approved, and added to the Record amongst the Record of Baltimore County Court, and signed to Law -

Sunday proposals for the Sale of Tobacco Warehouse and Lots, and of sites on which to erect such Warehouse, being received by the Executive - after mature Consideration it was agreed to accept the proposals of William P. O'Donnell, for their Tobacco Warehouse, and one hundred and five feet six inches front of the Vacant Ground adjoining, and also the proposal of Cumberland Ougan, as modified by Hammond Ougan, for his Warehouse and the Vacant ground adjoining, as laid down on a plot exhibited by William P. O'Donnell, marked W & O. and also Moses Sheppard's proposal of this date, for his Warehouse and Lot.

Ordered that the several Acts of Assembly, proposing alterations by or amendments to the Constitution, which were passed at December Session last, and also the act entitled An act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State be published, once a week for four weeks, in the Frederick Town Herald, in addition to the papers heretofore authorized to publish said Acts.

Ordered that Washington G. Cook, have the pump on the State House put in good repair.

His Excellency the Governor, Having received notice, agreeably to Law, from the President and Directors of the Baltimore and Annapolis Turnpike Road Company by John H. Harris Secretary to the said Company, that they have perfected five miles of the said Road, in addition to the fifteen miles already Licensed - Nominated and appointed John H. Miller, John Ogden and Robert Button, three Skilful and Judicious persons to view and examine the same, and report to him in writing, whether the said Road is, so far, executed in a masterly and workmanlike manner according to the true intent and meaning of the Act of incorporation of the said Company: and commission issued to them, accordingly.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted Pardon to Mary M. Allister (Richard Oakum) viz To Mary M. Allister for Felony, of which she had been convicted in Baltimore City Court and sentenced, on the 21st day of June 1824 to the Penitentiary for five years: she being recommended to Executive Clemency by the Directors of the Penitentiary; To Richard Oakum for Felony, of which he had been convicted in Prince Georges County Court, and sentenced, on the 14th day of September 1821 to the Penitentiary for seven years: he being also recommended to Executive Clemency by the Directors of the Penitentiary.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Nathaniel, on account of several prosecutions against him in Prince Georges County Court viz one for an assault & battery on Joseph C. Wilson; one for an assault & battery on Henry Burman and nine several cases for selling liquor without Licence: he being recommended to Executive Clemency by many respectable citizens of Prince Georges County, aforesaid.
