

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James A. Buchanan on
or order fifty two dollars for one quarters Rent Rent of Calhouns Store
Warehouse and the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Thomas
on order fifty two dollars and fifty cents for his salary as Announcer at
Easton from the 28th day of April to the 1st instant.

By a transcript from the proceedings of Anne Arundel County Court, it
appears, that Gunning Berford, David Williamson Senior, John Miller and
James Sloan, had entered into recognizance in the sum of \$300 each, for
their respective appearance before the said County Court, to testify for the State against
Richard B. Mitchell, which said recognizance was, by the said Court, at October
Term 1825, declared to be forfeited. The said Gunning Berford, David Williamson
Senior, John Miller and James Sloan, by their petition, represent, that they
should be among the last persons to disobey the Laws of their County, or to show
the least dis-respect to the Court; but they, and each of them, do aver in the
most solemn manner, that they had no recollection at October Term, of having
been recognized, nor have they to this moment, and that the first intimation
they had of having been recognized came from Annapolis Verbally. They,
therefore, pray to be relieved from the said forfeiture. And the Honble
Nicholas Price Chief Judge of the City Court of Baltimore, in which the said
recognizance was taken, and together with the trial of the said Richard B.
Mitchell removed to Anne Arundel County aforesaid, having stated his
entire confidence in the sincerity of the aforesaid statement of the petitioners;
and the County Court of Anne Arundel County aforesaid, having recommended
a remission of the aforesaid forfeiture. — the same is hereby remitted

By a transcript from the proceedings of Anne Arundel County Court,
it appears, that a certain Ellis Thomas Junior, being presented in the said County
Court, for an assault on David Middleton, entered into a recognizance in the
sum of \$300 for his appearance before the said Court, to answer for the said assault,
which said recognizance was, by the said Court, at October Term 1825, declared to
be forfeited. The said Ellis Thomas Junior by his petition, states, that he attended
the said Court at April Term 1825, three days, and the said David Middleton,
not attending during that time, his recognizance was respited and continued to October
Term; that at the October Term 1825 he failed to attend the said Court in consequence
of indisposition. — he, therefore, prays that the said forfeiture may be remitted;
and the Court having stated that they believe the facts set forth by the petitioner
to be true, and having recommended a compliance with the prayer of his petition —
