

By a transcript from the proceedings of Baltimore City Court, it appears, that John Wood of the said City, was by the said Court at some term last, fined the sum of five hundred dollars for selling Lottery Tickets without Licence. The said John Wood by his petition represents, that it was with no intention to evade the payment of the tax imposed for a Licence, that he imprudently suffered the sale of a few tickets or shares in his office, an office that had been regularly licensed to him and another in partnership, for the year ending on the first of June last. He further states, that at the end of the said year, the said partnership was dissolved, and that he was making arrangements to raise the sum of money requisite to procure a Licence in his own name, when the few sales aforesaid were permitted, to prevent the loss of business &c. He further states, that he did actually apply to the Clerk of the Court, and tender the sum of four hundred dollars on account of a Licence, but that the said Clerk considering he had no discretion to allow any credit, did not grant one on said application, but that on the first day of July, he did procure a Licence for the ensuing year. He also further represents, that he has a large family, more than eight children, dependent upon him for daily sustenance, and that he is wholly unable to pay the penalty imperitously imposed upon him by the un-yielding rigor of the Law, and he therefore prays a remission of the said fine. And the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the said petition - the said fine is hereby remitted.

By a transcript from the proceedings of Baltimore County Court, it appears, that the said Court, at March Term last, imposed two fines of sixteen dollars each, on John Christ of the said County, for selling liquor without a Licence. The said John Christ by his petition represents, that in 1818 he first commenced Tavern keeping, and living at a distance of twenty two miles from Baltimore, he has almost always sent down the money by some neighbour to take out his Licence, without coming himself, and that he did this in March or April 1825, but the person to whom the money was entrusted omitted to pay the same, but that he has since renewed his Licence. - He therefore prays that the said fines, be remitted. And sundry respectable citizens of Baltimore County, having stated, that being intimately acquainted with the petitioner, they believe him to be an honest, upright, industrious man, and that they are satisfied the facts stated by him are true; and the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the said petition. - the said fines are hereby remitted.
