Christian Abraham Heintken, having procured from his Commission as Consul of the Free and Hanseatic Town of Bremen, for the Port of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland. I do hereby recognize him as such and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to Consuls of the most friendly and favoured Nations in the United States.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the thirteenth day of May A D eight hundred and twenty six, and of the Independence of the United States of America the fiftieth.

The following Demand was made upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of Virginia for the persons therein named as fugitives from justice, upon application and the information and evidence therein mentioned, being filed in this Department viz

To His Excellency the Governor of the State of Virginia.

Whereas information hath been received at the Executive Department of this State that Elijah Hove, Isaac Dickey and John Watson are confined in the Jail of the Borough of Norfolk in the State of Virginia, by order of the Council of Quarter Sessions for the said Borough charged with the crime of Larceny of two free women of colour named Ann Robertson and her child John George Robertson, and Lucia Pitts committed in the City of Baltimore in this State, upon evidence which furnishes probable cause to believe that they are guilty of the said offence. Now, therefore, I Joseph Kent Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the United States, and the act of Congress passed on the twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety three entitled An act respecting fugitives
