

by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following civil appointments were made by and commissions issued accordingly. Viz

George G Brewer Esq, was appointed Register of the Land Office for the Western Shore, vice John Brewer deceased.

Brice Selby Esquire, was appointed Clerk of Montgomery County, vice Upton Beall deceased.

Phraim M. Wilson Esquire, was appointed an associate Judge of the South Judicial District, vice Whittington deceased.

By the petition of Levi Grigg of the City of Baltimore, accompanied by a transcript from the Records of Baltimore City Court, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at November Term 1824, the sum of one hundred dollars for receiving illegal fees as City Bailiff. The Petitioner states that the said fine was imposed for taxing commissions upon a distress for Rent, contrary to Law: that it has been a general practice amongst Constables in Baltimore, to tax the same Commissions for serving a distress for Rent, as sheriffs are authorized to take, and that they have been frequently advised from several Magistrates and others that they were authorized by Law to receive the Commissions. - he therefore prays that his fine may be remitted. And the said Court having stated that it having appeared on the trial, that the Traders acted in this instance, in conformity with the general practice and not from any design to extort or act illegally, and he having refunded the exact to the party grieved, the Court beg leave respectfully to recommend a remission of the fine, as the Traders paying the costs of prosecution. - we do, therefore, hereby remit the said fine.

By the petition of Anthony Kirby of Dorchester County, it is represented, that he was fined by the County Court of the said County, at October Term last, in four several cases, the sum of sixteen dollars in each case for selling liquor without Licence. The Petitioner states that he violated the Law from ignorance, being under the impression that he had a right to sell domestic spirituous liquor without Licence; that he is poor and can with difficulty make out to live, and if compelled to pay the said fine, his wife and children must be plunged into the poor House. - he therefore prays a remission of the said fines. And the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer of his petition. - we do hereby remit the said fines.
