By the petition of William Roberts of Montgomery County, accompanied by a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at its October Term 1826 the sum of twenty dollars for a breach of the peace. The petitioner states that he is now near fifty years of age and has never before been in Court under a presentment, and he always been considered a peaceable orderly citizen, & that he is not at all sorry his fine is so, therefore prays that it may be remitted. Kilgour one of the associate Judges of the said Court and being other respectable Citizens, having stated their belief of the truth of the petitioner's statement, and recommended a compliance with the prayer of his petition. We do, hereby, remit the said fine.
