The following Proclamation was this day issued by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Council Viz

By His Excellency Joseph Kent  
Governor of Maryland  
A Proclamation

Whereas a certain Arnold Jacobs hath been charged by indictment of the Grand Inquest enquiring for the County of Philadelphia, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with the crime of kidnapping a certain negro man called Emory Carter, and hath fled from the justice of the said Commonwealth into this State as it is said. And whereas His Excellency Andrew Shulze Governor of the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in pursuance of the Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded the said Arnold Jacobs of me as a fugitive from Justice, and that he should be arrested and delivered to John Thompson, Agent appointed to receive and convey said fugitive within the jurisdiction of the said Commonwealth for trial upon the said indictment: upon which demand the Sheriff of Queen Anne County, in whose Jurisdiction it was said the said Jacobs had sought refuge, was promptly ordered to arrest and deliver the said fugitive, in compliance with the said demand. And whereas it is represented that notwithstanding the order to the said Sheriff the said Arnold Jacobs has not been arrested and delivered to the said Agent, it being the imperious duty of the Executive of this State to use the most effectual means to cause the said fugitive to be arrested and delivered as aforesaid, to answer the charge aforesaid. Now therefore I Joseph Kent Governor of the State of Maryland have thought fit to issue this my Proclamation, and do by and with the advice and consent of the Council offer a reward Five hundred dollars to any person or persons who shall arrest the said Arnold Jacobs and deliver him to the said John Thompson, Agent as aforesaid or confine him in any jail so that he may be delivered to the said Agent or any other that may be duly appointed by His Excellency the Governor of the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to receive him.
