 the Executive, if their offer to pay should be accepted.

Upon consideration, when it was proposed to the approval of the  
 Treasurer, and order that upon the report of the Comptroller being made the  
 Clerk of the Council offer, through the hands of the Comptroller, to each person  
 that may be adjudged entitled to receive any portion of the valuation of the  
 property, the amounts to which they may, respectively, be adjudged entitled as  
 aforesaid.

 account of three several indentments pending against her in Baltimore City  
 Court charging her with "stealing" (See Pardon Record).
