

November 15th 1827.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Betty Simmony or order thirteen dollars fifty cents, for six months service in cleaning the public Temple, up to the first instant.

November 17th 1827.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Washington G. Cook or order one thousand and seventy dollars for covering the State House, to be accounted for.

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to John McCrea, on account of "passing Spurious Coin", of which he was convicted in Allegany County Court, at October Term last, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to John Nagle on account of "Forgery", of which he was convicted in Frederick County Court, on the 30th ultimo, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years. (See Pardon Record).

November 26th 1827.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Charles Parving on account of "Stealing", of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at November Term Instant. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency also granted a Nolle Prosequit to William M. Pherson, on account of a charge of "permitting a Gaming Table to be kept in his House", for which he was presented by the Grand Jury for Baltimore City Court. (See Pardon Record).

November 30th 1827.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Henry Thompson or order seventy nine dollars twenty cents for the purchase of Stationary for recording Chancery papers, under Resolutions of the General Assembly, to be accounted for.

December 6th 1827.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Stewart Esquire or order forty thousand six hundred and fifty dollars, in pursuance of the determination of the Jury appointed in virtue of an act of December 29th 1826 to settle finally the amount of Compensation to Cumberland Sugar for Tobacco Warehouse & Co.

December 12th 1827.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Henry Thompson or order sixty dollars and one cent for the purchase of fireworks, to be accounted for.
