Saturday January 5th 1828.

His Excellency the Governor, and the Honble William Stewart and Daniel Martin Members of the Council, attended in the Council Chamber.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry A. Buchanan or his five hundred dollars for one quarter Rent of Calhoun House Inspection House done the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or his forty eight dollars forty cents for Stationary for Chancery Office, of account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or his twenty dollar and ninety cents for Stationary for the Executive, of account allowed.

Sunday January 7th 1828.

This being the day appointed by the Constitution and Form of Government for the Election of Governor the General Assembly proceeded to said Election when His Excellency Joseph Kent was duly elected.

Tuesday January 8th 1828.

This being the day appointed by the Constitution and Form of Government for the Election of a Council to the Governor the General Assembly proceeded to said Election, when Daniel Martin Esquire of Talbot County, William Stewart Esquire of the City of Baltimore, Henry Dargy Esquire of Montgomery County, Arnold Edney Esquire of Somerset County, and Agnes Estep Esquire of Anne Arundel County, were duly elected.

His Excellency Joseph Kent Governor elect appeared this day in the Senate Chamber and in the presence of both Houses of the General Assembly, qualified by taking the Oath prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Constitution of the United States, and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, and thereupon His Excellency appeared in the Council Chamber.

January 10th 1828.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Warrant to William Dargy of Kent County, as a return of a charge, by indictment of the Grand Jurors of said County, preceding the Council.
