Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Daniel Martin Esquire or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary as a member of the Council due the first day of January last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Davis Esquire or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary as a member of the Council due the first day of April last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mr Anne Leback or order eighty dollars for six months pension due the first of June.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following civil appointments were made and commissions issued accordingly viz.

Richard H Brooks Esquire a Notary Public to reside at Upper Marlborough in Prince Georges County vice Taylor.

The board taking into consideration the third section of the Supplement of the last Session to the Act for the promotion of internal improvement, and a Resolution of the board of Directors of the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, (communicated by the Treasurer) by which the Cashier is authorized to give a premium of ten per cent for \$25000 of the 5 per cent Stock, redeemable at the pleasure of the State, at any time after fifty years, if that mode of paying the installment to that amount due and called for in the State Rail Road Stock, be adopted, and do advise the Treasurer and consent, that he take that alternative obtaining the premium so offered by the said Bank upon the conditions in the said Resolution stated, or any higher premium that may be offered, upon his advertising as usual for proposals for such stock. And they further advise and consent that he invest the premium to be obtained as aforesaid in Stocks of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, or any other Bank in this State, as he may think most advantageous.

Resolved that hereafter the Executive require that all accounts presented for their sanction, be verified by the oath of the party to whom such account purports to be due.

By the petition of James Holland and Rezin Baldwin of the City of Annapolis, accompanied by a transcript from the Record of Anne Arundel County Court, it appears that they entered into a recognizance in the sum of
