George Shafer Esquire additional Justice of the Peace of Washington County.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to a certain  
Simon Kauffman, on account of "stealing", of which he was convicted on the 29th  
day of June 1821, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for eight

His Excellency also this day granted a Pardon to a  
certain Rose Brown, alias Barnes of St. Marys County, on account of a charge  
of "Harbouring Negro Peter a runaway Slave of a certain Waring F. Moore",  
which was pending against her in St. Marys County Court. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also this day granted a Pardon to  
a certain James Marsh, on account of a charge of "passing and abetting"  
in carrying out of this State a negro boy called Dick, entitled to his freedom,  
which was pending against him in Caroline County Court. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also this day granted a Pardon to a  
certain Edward Fitzgerald of the City of Baltimore, on account of a  
charge of "keeping a Gaming Table", for which he was confined in the Jail  
of Frederick County, under a commitment by a Justice of the Peace  
of the said County. (See Pardon Record)
