As returns of the Deaf and Dumb in Talbot County being received, His Excellency the Governor selected Wesley Annanion, one of the said Deaf and Dumb, to receive the benefit of the act passed at the last Session of the General Assembly providing for the Education of the indigent deaf and dumb of this State, and directed that he be sent to the Pennsylvania institution, to be educated as provided for by the said act.

Proposals being received from Harris & Gill Reporters of the decisions of the Court of Appeals of this State, offering to contract with the Executive to deliver two hundred copies of each volume of their Reports, as they may be published, said Reports to be prepared upon the plan of the last volume of Harris and Angon's Reports, and contain about the same extent of information, at five dollars per volume, the Executive accept said offer, and contract with the said Harris and Gill for the said Reports, as required by Resolution of the General Assembly No 30 passed at December Session 1828.

Upon receipt of the information and evidence therein mentioned, the following Proclamation was issued, by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Council viz.

Whereas information hath been received at the Executive Department of this State that a most atrocious Murder was committed, on about the eighth ultimo, in Allegany County, on a certain Mary Swearingen by her husband George Swearingen, then Sheriff of Washington County; and that the said George Swearingen has fled from justice. And whereas it is of the first importance to Society that the perpetrators of such heinous crimes should be brought to condign punishment. Now therefore, I Joseph Kent Governor of the State of Maryland, have thought fit to issue this my Proclamation, and do by and with the advice and consent of the Council, offer a reward of three hundred dollars to any person or persons, who shall apprehend the said George Swearingen, and deliver him to the Sheriff of Allegany County aforesaid.

The said Swearingen is represented to be about five feet ten or eleven inches high, stout and well made, has a florid complexion, and light hair and eyes, and is about twenty seven or eight years of age. It is believed he has fled to the South.
