

for the body of Baltimore City, with stealing, more or about the 13th day of September last, one Bank Note called a Bank note of the Bank of Cape Fear, of the value of one dollar, and other Bank note of the State Bank of North Carolina, of the value of one dollar, sundry other Bank notes of different Banks, of the value of thirteen hundred and forty five dollars, and a quantity of Gold Bullion of the value of six thousand dollars, the property of John Erwin. And where information hath been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said John Camberton, has fled from Justice, and is now confined in Jail in Philadelphia. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of society, that the perpetrators of such offenses should be brought to Justice. And now, therefore, I, Joseph Kent, Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the Authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said John Camberton as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency, that I have appointed Thomas Ross and John Stewart, Gentlemen of the City of Baltimore, my agents to receive the said fugitive and bring him to this State, having Jurisdiction of the said offense, that he may be brought to trial therefor.

In compliance with the requisition of the Law, I herewith annex and procure to your Excellency a copy of the Proclamation, upon which this demand is founded, which I certify is authentic.

The following commission and instruction was issued to the appointed agents viz. The State of Maryland, To Thomas Ross and John Stewart of the City of Baltimore, Gentlemen, Greeting. Be it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence and honesty, I, Joseph Kent, Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you my agents to receive from His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, John Camberton a fugitive from the Justice of this State; and I do hereby authorize and direct you, upon receiving the said fugitive, to bring him into this State and convey and deliver him to the Sheriff of Baltimore County, to answer for having on or about the 13th day of September last stolen one Bank note called a Bank note of the Bank of Cape Fear, of the value of one dollar, and other Bank note of the State Bank of North Carolina, of the value of one dollar, sundry other Bank notes of different Banks of the value of thirteen hundred and forty five dollars, and a quantity of Gold Bullion of the value of six thousand dollars, the property of John Erwin, as charged by Proclamation of the Grand Inquest of the State of Maryland for the body of the City of Baltimore.
