He further states that he has had a commission as Justice of the Peace for sixteen years, and that this is the first and only instance in which the slightest impropriety of conduct has ever been imputed to him that he is poor, and that the payment of the said fine will be attended with great inconvenience of public sacrifice, he therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And the said Court, and many other respectable Citizens of the said County, having recommended compliance with the prayer of the petitioner we do hereby remit the said fine.
