By the petition of Jacob Hurst of Anne Arundel County, accompanied by transcripts from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court, at October Term 1828 the sum of ten dollars for an assault and Battery on Edward Jackson, and also the further sum of ten dollars for an assault and Battery on Thomas Parkinson. The Petitioner states that he was induced to commit said breaches of the peace by gross insults and provocations from the parties on whom they were committed, and he therefore prays to be released from the said fines. And sundry respectable citizens of the City of Annapolis having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, we do hereby remit the said fines.
