By the petition of John Green of Baltimore County, accompanied by a transcript from the record, it appears that he was found guilty at April Term 1820 of Baltimore County Court, upon his plea of "guilty", of selling liquor without licence, and fined by the said Court in the sum of fifty dollars and costs. - The Petitioner states that he has had licence for upwards of twenty years in Baltimore County, but that intending to remove to a different part of the County, he did not renew his licence. In consequence however of his Landlord offering better terms he determined to remain, and before he renewed his licence which he has now done, he sold a single glass of Cherry Brandy, which is the offence for which he has been convicted. He therefore prays a remission of the fine, which being recommended by the Court, and his character & that of his house being certified to be orderly & quiet by many respectable neighbours, we do hereby remit the said fine on payment of costs.
