

By the petition of Robert Lopez of Prince Georges County, accompanied by a transcript from the record, it appears that at April Term 1820 of Prince Georges County Court he was fined in four cases, sixteen dollars each, for selling liquor without license, and that he was also fined in two cases for breach of the peace, in one case one dollar, and twenty Cents, in the second.

The petitioner states that he is very poor, and unable to pay the fines, and that he was ignorant of the Law requiring him to take out license, and had no intention to defraud the State, and the Court and many respectable Citizens of Prince Georges County, having recommended a remission of the said fines, and do hereby remit all of said fines but the sum of sixteen dollars, upon payment of the whole Cost.
